


Prayer Shawl Pattern - Use #11 Circular needles ~ Need 3 skeins of yarn

Cast on 57 Stitches

First row: knit 3, pearl 3

2nd row: Start with the opposite stitch from what you ended on.
(ie if it was a knit then do a pearl)
